

Policy plan Global March Against Child Labour:

- the objective and the activities performed by the institution;

Objective : Stichting Global March Against Child Labour (Global March) works to ensure that all children can enjoy all their rights, that they have a free quality public education, and that they are protected from doing any work that could harm them or hinder their development.

Activities performed : Global March's approach is centered upon addressing child labour by engaging in collective action by combining grassroots interventions and advocacy with our civil society network and partners, towards advancing the rights of children, communities and promoting equality.

Working with NGOs, trade unions and teachers' associations from Global North and Global South, Global March undertakes a range of activities towards the elimination of child labour, viz :

Placing children and communities at the center:

- sensitizing children and communities on their rights to become agents of change
- supporting their active participation in democratic spaces, events and other platforms

Combining grassroots action and advocacy:

- bringing evidence from the ground to inform and influence commitments, policies and plans of governments and international stakeholders
- using international frameworks, treaties, conventions towards national advocacy for implementation at country and local levels
- advocating with governments and businesses to encourage the fulfillment of their responsibilities towards fulfillment of children's rights

Network/partner engagement:

- engaging with civil society to build their capacity, steer their leadership and promote their participation to address child labour, particularly in the global south
- being part and/or forming effective partnerships with different stakeholders

Advance rights and promote equality:

- root causes

In short, key activities range from lobby and advocacy, capacity building, piloting grassroots action to demonstrate impact, knowledge/evidence creation and public awareness.

- From where do we get our funding;

Stichting Global March Against Child Labour receives funds from governments, philanthropic foundations, and individuals.

- how the assets are being managed and spent.

All purchases of assets are approved according to the financial guidelines of the organization. The Management Committee (comprising 3 people) approves the purchase of all movable assets while the Board of Directors approves the purchase of all immovable assets. All fixed assets are recorded in fixed asset register of the organization

The following details/characteristics are recorded in the fixed assets register :

1. Category under which the asset falls – vehicles, furniture, office equipment, land and building, etc.
2. Name and description of the asset
3. Number of pieces
4. Paint/identification number(s) as painted on it/them
5. Location and by whom used
6. Cost of the asset inclusive of taxes/duties
7. Reference of the bank voucher number and date through which purchase paid for/accounted
8. Name of the supplier
9. Name of the donor/project
